
Big Dreams on Screen competition

No. The Zoom session will be set to a webinar session so you'll only see the authors on screen.

There is a chat function within Zoom that you can use to privately submit questions. Only adults over 16 should have access to this. To increase the chance of getting a school shout out and having your questions answered we recommend you submit them ahead of the event using the form on the relevant author page




