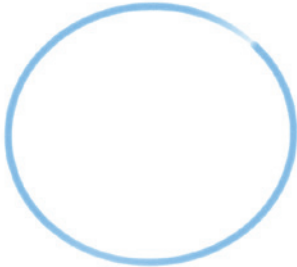


DRAW ZEKE ZERO

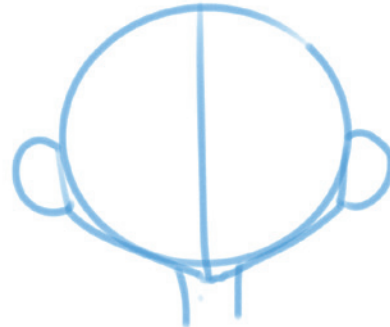
Learn to draw our unlikely hero Zeke Zero from
Star Breakers: Zeke Zero Vs The Galaxy.



TOP TIP: Draw with a light blue or very soft pencil first. Even a crayon would do! The first rule of drawing anything is to figure out the shape of it, and starting in a light pencil helps you work things out without worrying too much!



Step 1: Draw an oval. This is like a circle that's been squashed a little bit. Don't worry if it's a bit wonky - Star Breakers is a wonky comic!



Step 2: Draw a line cutting the oval in half, extend it down a little bit below the bottom. This is going to be where the chin is! Draw two ears on the sides of the oval and connect the bottom of each ear to the chin to make the jawline. Add on a neck too.



Step 3: The face! There's clever ways to figure this out but we'll keep it simple. The top of the nose sits roughly in the middle of the face - and is just an upside-down triangle! From there, we can work out the eyes - have fun with Zeke's expression, but the bottom of his eyes should line up with the top of the nose! Zeke's eyes are two curved lines sitting at a bit of an angle inward. Add a line for his smile (or a frown if you'd rather have him look a bit grumbly!)



Step 4: The hair! Zeke's hair is messy, as there's a lack of combs, washing facilities and hairdressers on Grimlax! The main events are three triangles on one side (usually decided by whichever way he's facing), two smaller triangles on the opposite side and then a little tuft of hair somewhere close by to those.



Step 5: If you're happy with your light pencil work (and you should be!), you can then be brave and start to add darker lines over what you've drawn!
